Dating: God's Perfect Choice?

Bible Study (Core text 1 Corinthians 6:12-20 & 7)

Introduction: How can God demonstrate His choice for a perfect mate? Our dating society is vastly different than courting was 100 years ago. Before the industrial age, those wanted to marry relied heavily upon parental involvement. But, today many do not have this support and need to seek other support. God is willing to reveal His choice for if you are willing to take steps in faith.

Group Discussion (Optional): How and when should a single Christian choose whom to date? What guidelines can a Christian follow to stay sexually pure until marriage? If parents are not available, who can offer Godly protection and help in finding a spouse? (Give examples)

Prayer: O God, You are my God; I shall seek You earnestly; My soul thirsts for You. Jesus, I may have at times felt an emptiness because I am not married. But I proclaim today that I will now seek You first and will not be in want of any good thing, including my marriage partner. For the sake of my future spouse, I commit to you Lord and trust in You for a perfect marriage partner. In Jesus Name I pray. (Adapted Psalms)

Action (Faith found in James): Do a self-examination: Are you seeking God first? Do you hang out with Godly friends? Are you attending a church that promotes sexual purity? If possible, ask for parental help with dating or seek out mature Godly counsel.

Sex: God's Design

(Bible Study – Core text 1 Corinthians 6:12-20 & 7)

Introduction: TV, the internet, magazines, etc. all bombarded peoples minds with sexualized images. Today's motto is "Sex sells!" Many youths see sex as a rite of passage into an adult, rather than a cherished marriage gift. The sexual consequences can be severe: over 2,000 teenage pregnancies, 3,287 abortions, 10,000+ contract Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, Genital Herpes, HPV, or HIV/AIDS, a day, while 50% of the current youth will contract an STD before the age of 25. These are the consequences of living outside God's design for sex.

Group Discussion (Optional): Read about King David 2 Sam. 11 & 12. What caused his fall? How was David restored? What were the consequences for violating God's design? What are the consequences today for those who violate God's design for sex? Could an argument be made that David is the greatest King of Israel? (See Psalm 51)

Prayer: Think of the ways you are like King David. Reread Psalm 51 and make it your prayer to God. Come to Jesus with a pure heart by repenting of any past/or present (sexual) sins. (Heb. 4:15-16; Act. 3:19)

Action (Faith found in James): Remove all sexualized images (nudity) as commanded by Jesus. (Mat. 5:27-30) Search out your life, home, closets, computers, TVs, DVDs, and any other place you may have pornography, etc. Jesus said to "cut it off," to remove sinful temptations because it is better to chop off a hand than to lose one's soul.

Marriage: God's Covenant

(Bible Study – Core text 1 Corinthians 6:12-20 & 7)

Introduction: Today, the media often portrays sexual love outside God's marriage covenant. God created and designed marriage as a life long covenant of two bodies (souls) that become one. This covenant is based upon a spousal love that always has the others interests at heart. The Song of Solomon illustrates this loving covenant. Solomon's wife proclaims: "I am my beloved's, And his desire is for me." (SoS. 7:10)

The Bible Says...

- 1. Marriage God's covenant is based upon an unbreakable bonding of flesh, mind, will, and soul. Sexual intimacy is not the ultimate purpose for marriage, yet God places in each of us need to be sexually devoted to only one person. The husband is to... (Complete Ecc. 9:9)
- 2. The husband's (wife's) sexual feelings are to be directed toward whom? (SoS. 7:10)
- 3. The Song of Solomon is God's sex manual. What is the attitude that a husband and a wife are to have towards each other? (SoS. 7:10; 2:16; 6:3)

Sex was created and ordained by God. And for our protection, He issued the sexual guidelines in the Old Testament. It contains the who, why, when, and how for sex within marriage. The underlining guiding principle for sexual intercourse is found in Hebrews.

22. Read SoS. 4:1-9. Describe the man's attraction to the bride's physical qualities. What does this do to a man's heart?
23. Emotional and erotic love will not sustain a marriage relationship, and that is why God's marriage covenant is until

death. Read Col. 3:8-17 and use it as a guide to define God's marital love?

Action (Faith found in James): Write a love letter by hand to your wife or husband using the Song of Song as your inspirational guide. [i.e. "Behold, you are beautiful, my love! Behold, you are beautiful! You have doves' eyes." (SoS. 1:15)] Affirmation of your love towards each other is key to living in the covenant. Be genuine; only use words that are your own, you will be amazed at the result. Do it today.

Group Discussion (Optional): Read Eph. 5. Paul talks about the husband who needs to "love" his wife and how a wife needs to "respect" her man. Does is take more than feelings and actions to sustain God's marriage covenant? Why? (Col. 3:12-17 and #28) How do your current actions demonstrate God's covenantal love towards her or him? What do you say and do that makes her feel loved or him respected?

Prayer: God fulfills Your word and bring me to your marriage covenant. I know your plans are for my well-being and not calamity. Teach me Your beloved holy ways, put on me a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience; allowing me to bear with one another, and forgiving others. I now give you my whole heart so that I may be found by You and You will restore the fortunes of Your Holy marriage be and that I will live my marriage in honor to You. In Christ Jesus' name, I pray!

Family: God's Blessings

(Bible Study – Core text 1 Corinthians 6:12-20 & 7)

Introduction: God created the family structure to pass on His blessings. In modern Western cultures, it is widely acknowledged that the family is in serious trouble. Have you heard the term "dysfunctional family"? Most families do not receive these blessings. God designed the core family structure for protection and benefit. Within a Godly family, we learn His love, discipline, self-sacrifice, self-control, gentleness, patience, more. There is no better classroom to learn and model Godly attributes than within the family. Strong, loving families do exist today. But if you want to receive God's blessings you will need to know His guiding principles.

The Bible Says...

There are many examples in the Old Testament of children from Godly parents who did not return: Adam's and Eve's Cain (Gen. 4); Eli's sons (1 Sam. 2:22-24); David's Absalom (2 Sam. 13-19); Solomon's Rehoboam (1 Kings 12-15). Like God, parents are not in control of a child's free will, nor are they able to guarantee that children will become Christians.

Does a Godly home guarantee Godly children? Why?

Prayer: Lord Jesus give me the Father heart of God. Show me how I can be compassionate and gracious; slow to anger, and abounding in loving-kindness and truth. Make my heart like your tender heart so that I may forgive my family members for their sins, just as You have forgiven me. Teach me how to forgive my (parents, child, spouse, etc. put in name)

______. In Jesus name, I pray. (Continue for each member.)

Action (Faith found in James): What actions can you take today to become a better child, parent, and grandparent? I once counseled a man who needed to make peace with his departed father. He wrote a letter expressing regrets, anger, and unforgiveness. Then visiting the grave, he read the letter. Can you incorporate [Eph. 4:32 "Be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you."] into a letter/phone call to a parent or child? Making family peace will bring times of refreshing and blessing from the presence of the Lord. (Acts 3:19; Isa. 9:6)
