Church Prayers - Creeds

The Lord's Prayer

Pray then like this: "My Father in heaven hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give me this day my daily bread, and forgive me my sins, as I choose to forgive those who have sinned against me. And lead me not into temptation, but deliver me from the devil and evil." AMEN! (From Mat. 6:9-13 ESV)

The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Jesus is Lord. Great indeed, I confess, is the mystery of godliness: He was manifested in the flesh, vindicated by the Spirit, seen by angels, proclaimed among the nations, believed on in the world, taken up in glory. Lord, to whom shall I go? You have the words of eternal life, and I have believed and have come to know, that You are the Holy One of God. That Christ died for my sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that He appeared to all the apostles. By this, I know the Spirit of God: every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh and is from God. I now confess Jesus is my Lord and Savior! AMEN! (From Deu. 6:4, 1 Cor. 8:4; Rom. 10:9, Phil 2:11; 1 Tim. 3:16; Joh. 6:68-69; 1 Cor. 15:3-7;1 Joh. 4:2)

Apostle Paul's Creed

"This is the gospel which I (Paul) preached by which I am saved and me too if I hold fast this word. That Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that He appeared to disciples. Now if Christ is preached, that He has been raised from the dead, how do some among us say that there is no resurrection of the dead? But if there is no resurrection of the dead, not even Christ has been raised; and if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is vain, and our faith also is vain.

God raised Jesus the Christ!. For if the dead are not raised, not even Christ has been raised; and if Christ has not been raised, our faith is worthless; am I still in my sins?

If we have hoped in Christ in this life only, Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who are asleep. For since by a man came death, by a man also came the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ, I am made alive. Christ will return and at His coming, then comes the end, when He hands over the kingdom to the God and Father. He has abolished all rule and all authority and power. Christ must reign until He has put all His enemies under His feet. The last enemy that will be abolished is death. Yet, I, as Paul did, die daily. If from human motives.

"How then are the dead raised? And with what kind of body do they come?" That which I sow does not come to life unless it dies. So also is the resurrection of the dead. It is sown a perishable body, it is raised an imperishable body; it is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory; it is sown in weakness, it is raised in power; it is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual body. So also it is written, "The first MAN, Adam (Christ), BECAME A LIVING SOUL." The last Adam has become my life-giving spirit.

However, the spiritual is not first, but the natural; then the spiritual. The first man is from the earth, earthy; the second man is from heaven. As is the earthy, so also are those who are earthy; and as is the heavenly, so also are those who are heavenly. Just as I have borne the image of the earthy, I will also bear the image of the heavenly.

Behold, I agree with the Apostle Paul and declare this mystery; I will all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet; for the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and I will be changed. For this perishable must put on the imperishable, and this mortal must put on immortality. But when this perishable will have put on the imperishable, and this mortal will have put on immortality, then I along with all the saints will come into what is written:

"DEATH IS SWALLOWED UP in victory. "O DEATH, WHERE IS YOUR VICTORY? O DEATH, WHERE IS YOUR STING?"

The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law; but thanks be to God, who gives me the victory through the Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, I will remain steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that my toil is not in vain in the Lord." AMEN! (Adapted from 1 Cor. 15:1-58)

Apostles' Creed A.D. 200-900

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, the Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord: Who was conceived of the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He arose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; He shall return to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen!

Nicene Creed A.D. 325

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through Him, all things were made. For us and for our salvation He came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit He became incarnate from the Virgin Mary and was made a man. For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate: He suffered death and was buried. On the third day, He rose again in accordance with the Scriptures: He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and His kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father. With the Father and the Son, He is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Chalcedonian Creed A.D. 451

We, then, following the holy Fathers, all with one consent, teach men to confess one and the same Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, the same perfect in Godhead and also perfect in manhood; truly God and truly man, of a reasonable soul and body; consubstantial with us according to the manhood; in all things like unto us, without sin; begotten before all ages of the Father according to the Godhead, and in these latter days, for us and for our salvation, born of the virgin Mary, the mother of God, according to the manhood; one and the same Christ, Son, Lord, Only-begotten, to be acknowledged in two natures, unchangeably, indivisibly, inseparably; the distinction of natures being by no means taken away by the union, but rather the property of each nature being preserved, and concurring in one Person and one Subsistence, not parted or divided into two persons, but one and the same Son, and only begotten, God the Word, the Lord Jesus Christ, as the prophets from the beginning have declared concerning Him, and the Lord Jesus Christ Himself taught us, and the Creed of the holy Fathers has handed down to us. AMEN!

Chicago Statement on Biblical Inerrancy 1978

God, who is Himself Truth and speaks truth only, has inspired Holy Scripture in order thereby to reveal Himself to lost mankind through Jesus Christ as Creator and Lord. Redeemer and Judge. Holy Scripture is God's witness to Himself. The Holy Scripture, being God's own Word, written by men prepared and superintended by His Spirit, is of infallible divine authority in all matters upon which it touches: It is to be believed, as God's instruction, in all that it affirms; obeyed, as God's command, in all that it requires: embraced, as God's pledge, in all that it promises. The Holy Spirit, Scripture's divine Author, both authenticates it to us by His inward witness and opens our minds to understand its meaning. Being wholly and verbally Godgiven, Scripture is without error or fault in all its teaching, no less in what it states about God's acts in creation, about the events of world history, and about its own literary origins under God. than in its witness to God's saving grace in individual lives. The authority of Scripture is inescapably impaired if this total divine inerrancy is in any way limited of disregarded, or made relative to a view of truth contrary to the Bible's own; and such lapses bring serious loss to both the individual and the Church. AMEN!

National Association of Evangelicals
